Pastors who celebrated an ordination anniversary since our last presbytery meeting were recognized with a CD entitled "Laughter From the Well." There were 62 pastors named with 33 years as the average years of service.

Rev. Frank Vardeman, General Presbyter shared that more than 160 youth and adults came through the 2012

Geneva Center summer program, many of whom shared that they found God and Christ for the first time in their lives. And not to forget that Geneva Center is a hospitality site for retreats and conferencing. He also expressed a prayer that the presbytery will exist for mission, like a fire exists for burning.

An entertaining and insightful presentation on the 2012 General Assembly in Pittsburgh was given by GA Commissioners **Rev. Jerry Egger**, First PC Rensselaer, **Rev. Mary Ann Banning**, First PC Mishawaka and **Elder Andy Betts**, Sunnyside PC

South Bend.

Elder Pam Camren, First PC Mishawaka presented a first reading of changes to the bylaws and standing rules. A vote will be taken in November.

Rev. Tom Albaum, First PC Monticello reported for the Administrative Commission for First Presbyterian Church, Rensselaer. A vote taken to give the AC original jurisdiction was approved unanimously.

The **Stewardship Ministry Team** will be offering three continuing education opportunities around the presbytery over the next few months. Presbytery peacemaking grants are now overseen by the Stewardship Ministry Team. We heard a report from **Rev. Terri Thorn**, First PC Lebanon on the work of the Transformation Ministry Team, as well as the experience of her congregation in Wave 3.

Rev. Anna Parkinson, First PC Goshen reported on the New Development Ministry Team and their vision for future activity.

Elder Ann Bingaman shared that the Ministerial Excellence Fund Team wrote a renewal proposal and received confirmation from the Lilly Foundation that monies have been extended for four more years. A broad range of funding has been given out and ministers are encouraged to apply for additional grants.

Rev. Kevin Bowers, Bethany PC Lafayette reported on the work of the Administrative Commission with Faith, west Lafayette, which has centered to date on determining how to implement charges of the AC in partnership with representatives of the congregation.
