

# What does the Bible say?

About resources, faith, money, and stewardship? Here are 27 passages to ponder:

The choicest of the first fruits of your ground you shall bring into the house of the Lord your God.  
*Exodus 23:19*

All tithes from the land, whether the seed from the ground or the fruit from the tree, are the Lord's; they are holy to the Lord. *Leviticus 27:30*

Behold, to the Lord your God belong heaven and the highest heavens, the earth and all that is in it.  
*Deuteronomy 10:14*

Set apart a tithe of all the yield of your seed that is brought in yearly from the field. *Deuteronomy 14:22*

Give generously and be ungrudging when you do so, for on this account the Lord your God will bless you in all your work and in all that you undertake. *Deuteronomy 15:10*

All shall give as they are able, according to the blessing of the Lord your God that he has given you.  
*Deuteronomy 16:17*

The people rejoiced because they had offered so willingly, for they made their offering to the Lord with a whole heart... *I Chronicles 29:9*

... The righteous are generous and keep giving. *Psalms 37:21*

Honor the Lord with your substance and with the first fruits of all your produce; then your barns will be filled with plenty, and your vats will be filled with wine. *Proverbs 3:9-10*

Some give freely, yet grow all the richer; others withhold what is due, and only suffer want. A generous person will be enriched, and one who gives water will get water. *Proverbs 11:24-25*

Those who are generous are blessed, for they share their bread with the poor. *Proverbs 22:9*

Do not wear yourself out to get rich; be wise enough to desist. *Proverbs 23:4*

The faithful will abound with blessings, but one who is in a hurry to be rich will not go unpunished.  
*Proverbs 28:20*

Whoever loves money never has money enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with his income. This too is meaningless. *Ecclesiastes 5:10*

Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house, and thus put me to the test, says the Lord of hosts; see if I will not open the windows of heaven for you and pour down for you an overflowing blessing. *Malachi 3:10*

“No one can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.” *Matthew 6:24*

Do not worry, saying, ‘What will we eat?’ or ‘What will we drink?’ or ‘What will we wear?’ For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. *Matthew 6:31-33*

What will it profit a man to gain the whole world and forfeit his life? *Mark 8:36*

“Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.” *Luke 3:11*

Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. *Luke 6:30*

“Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back.” *Luke 6:38*

In all this I have given you an example that by such work we must support the weak, remembering the words of the Lord Jesus, for he himself said, ‘It is more blessed to give than to receive.’” *Acts 20:35*

The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. *II Corinthians 9:6-8*

He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. *II Corinthians 9:10*

Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for you reap whatever you sow. *Galatians 6:7*

We brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains. *I Timothy 6:7-10*

If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, “Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill,” and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? *James 2:15-16*
